Current Projects and Activities

- MCRIC Team Awarded BJAG Grant to Advance Predictive Analytics Partnership Project with the <u>City of Salisbury</u>. This project aims to enhance proactive policing strategies, reducing crime in a way that will also improve feelings of safety, fairness and trust.
- <u>New UMD Research Focuses on Improving Police Community Relationships in Baltimore.</u> Informed by community interviews, this study aims to understand sources of community-police tensions and explore tangible ways of improving the delivery of services.
- MPower Grant Funds New Research Focused on Comparing Firearm Violence from Trauma Units and Police. The goal is to understand trends and community perceptions of lethal and non-lethal gun violence using a collaborative, community-based approach. Findings will inform the development of strategies for gun violence prevention and intervention.
- <u>UMD's Maryland Crime Research and Innovation Center Launches Study to Assess Pretrial</u> <u>Outcomes Across Maryland.</u> The research team is analyzing routine patterns of pretrial processes to help inform jurisdictions' decision making and efforts to reduce the local detention population while protecting public safety.
